Parking update

There are about twenty-one parking spaces and another ten on the grass.

Shuttle spaces will be reserved as well as the Minister's space and some staff space for unloading.

Sequoia Farm has space for 10-15 vehicles and has offered to allow parking overflow there. They will open the gate between 9:30 am and 1:30 pm for us to use the parking space. This is a handshake agreement now, and we can check in with them after a few Sundays to see how things are going. We may be able to extend our liability insurance to cover using their lot if needed.

Volunteers will provide shuttle service from the overflow parking. Discussion was held on timing of the shuttle trips. It was suggested that a 10:20 am shuttle be done to allow people to attend the Meditation, which is scheduled for 10:30 am Sunday morning. Another shuttle could be done at 10:50 am to allow people to arrive in time for services. After service shuttles could be run at similar intervals.

We will have a shuttle for Saturday night's open house. Anyone that shows up as early as 5:00 pm will be put to work getting everything ready for the event to start at 5:30 pm.

Conscious Giving Program update

The budget for the fall program is \$1500.

Three catering options were discussed. Bayview Thriftway can provide food for \$24/person if CSL picks up the food, the cost is \$32/person delivered. EZ catering was also contacted and Roaming Hunger food trucks. The food truck option would involve providing our event information to Roaming Hunger, they would provide the information to food trucks to allow them to submit bids for the event.

Discussion of floor plans and how to provide seating. A cap of 45-60 people for the event was discussed.

An idea was presented of having tables bid on which table goes through the dessert line first.

Holli Sharp is a graphic artist from the CSL home office, and she will create graphics for the theme of the event, "Dancing in the Flow." Holly will donate her time and talent in creating the graphics.
