Staff Contracts Laura

Changes to the Custodial contract include specifics for closing by following the Closing checklist. Teri confirmed that she has made this change to the contract.

Laura hasn't received most of the Council members evaluations of the new employees yet. She sent the questions out on June 18<sup>th</sup>. Teri and Buffie have completed theirs.

Council had a clarifying discussion regarding how to do the evaluations.

Discussion on billing and tracking hours for groundskeeping. Groundskeeping can be billed by job or by hours. There is no hourly wage listed in the groundskeeping contract although the contract states that the groundskeeping will be billed hourly up to \$300/mon.

Laura's suggestion is that we pay the budgeted \$300 per month. If the work that we want done cannot be accomplished, a new discussion will need to be had on how much time the requested items will take.

The time and tasks will be different and take different times seasonally.

Rev. David offered that at the Centers he's been a part of before there was a volunteer component and a professional was hired for some specific things.

Evaluate to verify if the essential tasks are being done and to the quality level we want.

Council approved paying the Groundskeeper a \$300/mo. flat fee.

Luminary Parade Tiffany

The CSL Olympia office was contacted by someone that works with the City Arts program regarding a workshop for how to make luminaries like the ones that are used in the Luminary Parade connected to the Procession of the Species for Earth Day in April. The workshop is free and paid for by a grant. The workshop is offered on three days.

Tiffany was curious if the CSL community might be interested in participating in a future parade and perhaps some of us would be interested in going to the workshop. Tiffany has already contacted Adrienne in case this was an activity that the youth might want to do.

Tiffany will forward the email with the registration information and contact. Buffie expressed interest in attending.

Holistic Fair Teri & Tiffany

Teri shared that we need someone to be on the committee to assist with food and to work on the raffle. Kathy G. volunteered to work on the food.

Teri will bring it up at the Community meeting.

Beth reported about a local holistic fair she attended, and she was disappointed. The fair only had 4 vendors and very little attendance.

Discussion about speakers at the fair. Vendor's will be able to use one of the youth rooms for small group talks.
