Stewardship Campaign

We need people to step up to be investors not just attendees at the Center. People tend to make this step as they start living the principles.

The Stewardship campaign celebration dinner will be on Nov.12th.

Council will be meeting after the visioning on the 24th to make a few plans.

Postponing Holistic Fair

There were several factors that lead to the postponement of the Holistic fair.

- A vendor made the request for a \$50 fee instead of \$100.
- Another fair was scheduled the week before our fair. That fair was downtown during the Arts Walk and they were only charging \$50 to vendors.
- A committee member made the suggestion to postpone the fair until after the new year.
- A postponement would allow more time to build a better fair. We could select a time when there are fewer competing events both at the Center and in the community.

We contacted 32 legacy vendors, 24 new local vendors, and Teri personally spoke to vendors at the Ocean Shores Fair. We had a minimum of 62 people that were contacted regarding being a vendor.

We had 3 vendors committed at the time of postponement. Buffie had two additional vendors ready to commit. Tiffany had an additional 3 vendors express interest since the decision was made to postpone.

No vendors were from our CSL community.

Twenty vendors are what was decided was the capacity for the Center.

The committee membership suggested January as the new time for the Fair. Tiffany suggested that Spring might be better since people will have attended all types of events through the holidays.

There was a discussion and concern about postponing events. The Council is grateful to Tim for his support during that discussion.
