Science has frequently been surprised to realize that the way it thinks of things is suddenly proven completely wrong or, at the very least, only partially so. We, too, are prone to see


How can you outgrow the limits that do not protect you? How can you unlearn the stories that keep you from being who you truly are?

JULY YOUTH PROGRAM:

Deep Waters, Deeper Wisdom: Embodying Spiritual Intelligence and Authentic Boundaries

This July, we honor the deep waters within — the place where wisdom, strength, and authenticity live. Youth are invited into a soulful exploration of inner wisdom, personal boundaries, and the courage to be fully themselves. Through marine metaphors, spiritual truths, and embodied activities, we dive beneath the surface of who we think we are — discovering the depth, power, and clarity that lives within.



July 6: Remember with the River Dolphins

We begin by remembering the Truth of who we are — a divine, unrepeatable expression of Spirit. Inspired by the book *Undrowned* and the intuitive play of river dolphins, youth explore ancestral wisdom and the beauty of shedding limiting stories. Through meditation and movement, we attune to the still small voice within and create "Truth Streamers" with affirmations that flow from the heart.

July 13: Breathe — It's Shark Week!

Sharks remind us to keep moving forward and trust our instincts. Inspired by Ernest Holmes' wisdom, youth celebrate their unique spirit and resilience. After a brief reflection on what it means to be fully themselves, youth will head outside for a high-energy "Shark Tag: Be Your Boldest Self" game. In this playful version of tag, each player takes on a God-quality (like Joy, Strength, or Wisdom) and must move, speak, or act in a way that expresses that quality while evading the "doubt sharks." Afterward, we circle up for a "deep dive share," connecting movement with

meaning and affirming: I am whole, I am powerful, I am enough.

July 20: Honor Your Boundaries

This week centers on the practice of setting life-giving boundaries. Youth reflect on what a wholehearted "yes" and "no" feel like in their bodies. Through guided discussion and roleplay, they explore how to stay true to themselves with kindness. We craft "Energy Shields" — visual reminders of what helps us thrive and how to respond when our boundaries are tested.

July 27: Go Deep

Together, we explore what lies beneath our reactions and habits. Through storytelling, journaling, and a sensory-based "Ocean Depth Walk," youth reflect on what grounds them. They learn that like swim bladders in deep-sea fish, we all have inner ballast that helps us maintain our place in the world with grace and connection.

Practitioner Corner with Buffie

Your Deep Knowing

As I reflect on my journey in the past few months, the July talk topic of Deep Knowing comes into a renewed focus for me.

In April, I attended the School of Spiritual Leadership's All-Campus Retreat for ministerial students. Over 40 of my classmates were at this retreat at Asilomar, coming from all parts of the country. We brought joy, laughter, and an eagerness to get to know each other more deeply, face-to-face. The title of this retreat was Living the Call, and our focus for all three days was on this thing...the Call. What is this call, you might ask? Is it a call to be a Minister? Possibly. A call to be of service? Most definitely. But what else? We were invited in multiple ways to explore our own journeys and share with our classmates as we sought to define what this Call means for each of us. For some of us it was Spirit's soft tap on the shoulder, or a repetitive nudge, saving you must do this, so that you can do THIS. For others, it was a complete surprise, as they found themselves saying yes to the journey without a clear destination in mind. The education we are each undergoing is usually helpful, occasionally annoying, and always a practice of allowing something

new to unfold within our own souls. And we are all consciously and intentionally grateful for the supportive fellowship we are developing among ourselves, so that we, in turn, support our spiritual communities in whatever capacity our Call leads us to.

This is Deep Knowing, in actual practice. And it is available for each of us. We need only open our hearts to the possibility of something even better, even more magnificent, just waiting for us around the (very small) corner. As I often remark, we are not here to do this alone—if we were, we'd each be on our own island! Exploring that Deep Knowing with others is a whole lot more rewarding.
